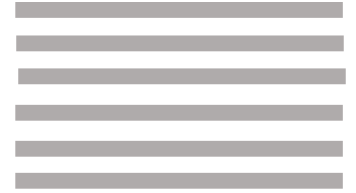


PASTOR TO PASTOR TRAINING NETWORKS

What makes P2P Go?

Pastor to Pastor Networks go because of three core values through which we filter everything. They form the acronym “CAR.”

- C – Contextual
- A – Accessible
- R – Reproducible



During our first newsletter we discussed how critical it is for our schools to be reproducible. In this article, I want to discuss what it means to be contextual. For us, being contextual is about being field driven. Our schools must reflect the needs and culture of the field.

Every field is a different context with its own language, history, values, culture, issues, and patterns. We must be sensitive to each context and present training in a way that works for the pastors and leaders in each area. Both our content and our approach need to be field driven in order to be contextual.

Our content is developed with pastors from developing countries in mind. It is biblical and practical rather than academic. It also addresses many needs and struggles pastors face in such areas.

Our twelve courses are designed to address the needs of pastors from a variety of contexts. Our teachers also have the freedom to adjust the material to address local needs and issues. We encourage teachers to develop insights and illustrations that speak to local needs.

Not only does our content need to be field driven, but so too does our approach. We seek neutral locations, so pastors from all denominations feel comfortable attending. We are flexible with times and dates. We are even flexible regarding the courses being taught. Although, we are confident that our 12 courses will be helpful for most pastors, we do recognize that not every course will fit every context.

The bottom line is that we approach each location and school with fresh eyes to present each school in a way that maximizes impact and participation. This approach honors the local leaders, honors the Lord, and allows us to be faithful to our mission.

I will close by reminding you once again of our mission.

Because many pastors worldwide have no access to quality training, they often struggle in a variety of areas:

Our goal is to start training movements around the world by equipping national leaders with resources and strategies that empower them to train every pastor in their country.

Training Pastors to Train Pastors

On July 12, I led a training in Horconcitos Honduras for pastors wishing to train other pastors. These are men from Honduras wishing to lead schools in Honduras. This picture shows the pastors and some of their families.

I expected around 10 pastors to attend. 23 attended the 3 hour training. The pastors indicated that only 20% of the pastors they know have training. At least half of the group committed to begin new schools where pastors have no opportunity to be trained. Some indicated they have already begun to promote the training in new areas. One pastor indicated he already has 30 pastors in one area waiting for him to begin a new school.



We are on Air!

The Peruvian Andes is a vast and mountainous region for thousands of square miles. It is difficult for many pastors to attend. God is opening doors in many areas for our courses to be taught on both radio and television.



The picture shows Julio Rojas Flores teaching one of our courses in Quechua from a radio station in Peru. In Uripa Peru, our courses are also being video-taped and televised. We are confident that many pastors are able to receive training in this way. Furthermore, many others are able to listen to courses on Theology, Hermeneutics, New and Old Testament, etc. There are not a lot of media options in the Andes. We believe God is using these courses to help people understand more about God in this predominantly Catholic country.

We continue to be amazed at how God is blessing our schools. Please be praying that God will continue to honor our work, give us wisdom, and empower our efforts so many more pastors can be trained.
