Our largest class to date taught in Tinke Peru this February. We taught Preaching to 130 people. This record held for 2 days until we reached Paucartambo, and we taught 200 people!

Incredible Response in Cusco Area

On February 14th, myself and Buck Burch from the Georgia Baptist Mission Board, flew into Cusco and headed for the mountains. After a six-hour car ride we arrived in Tinke which sits at nearly 15000 feet. We were advised that we might have nearly 100 pastors. We taught 130, most of whom have never had access to pastoral training before. The excitement and joy of being taught how to teach and preach God's Word caused the training to have the spirit of a festival or celebration.

We then made our way to Paucartambo over a 15000 foot pass literally dodging mudslides and rockslides in the mountains. Approximately 200 people attended the training in Paucartambo, and roughly 80 were pastors. We were informed that at least another 40 pastors could not attend because of road closures due to mudslides. Julio Rojas Flores traveled to their location after our trip to teach these pastors, so they would be caught up with the group. They are all excited for our return, when we will teach Hermeneutics.



We then travelled 10 hours and over a different 15000 foot pass to the city of Quillabamba, the launching point for Machu Pichu. We taught 100 people in Quillabamba, and about 60 were pastors. This was our most enthusiastic group. By the time the course finished after 2 days,

we already had another location scheduled in Urubamba, which is about half way between Cusco and Quillabamba. Pastors were on their phones during breaks telling their colleagues in other cities they need to come or have us present a training in their region.

We are already trying to focus on multiplication because we cannot possibly train all of the pastors who desire training. May we start a true movement of God amongst these wonderful pastors and people.



The Impact of Coronavirus on P2P

The worldwide Coronavirus pandemic is disrupting life and travel everywhere. The impact of the virus has also brought our training to an abrupt halt. Even as I type these words I am supposed to be training pastors in new locations in Nicaragua. I likewise had to cancel a trip to Minsk, Belarus. I have put other trips on hold to Costa Rica, Argentina, Guatemala, Sierra Leone, and Ecuador. All this to say that Coronavirus has currently shut us down. I admit that all of this is frustrating because we have incredible momentum, and I don't want to lose that.

While our training has shut down, our planning and collaboration is continuing. Once the travel ban is lifted we are poised to immediately begin new schools in Costa Rica, Nicaragua and Ecuador. We have also been in fruitful discussions with the Baptist seminary in Argentina. They have an extensive satellite network of locations for distance learning and

cannot service them all. We believe we will be able to work in conjunction with the seminary to train pastors in many out of the way locations. We also have partners in Guatemala and are working to schedule our first trainings in that country. In short, the need to train pastors is greater than ever. Our national partners are reaching out during this time to ensure we intend to return. Of course we intend to return and continue this vital kingdom work.
