## Wonderful Graduation in San Salvador

P2P graduated 86 students in December from San Salvador, Usulután, and Zacatecoluca. The graduation was electric and incredibly exciting due to the energy and excitement brought by the pastors themselves. Four different cohorts were represented and each decided to represent their cohort with matching ties or red, blue, yellow, or green. Rarely have I witnessed such pride and sense of accomplishment. The auditorium was overflowing. It was a magnificent day!

Each one brimming with new confidence in their knowledge and ability to impact God's kingdom. Their preaching and leadership have improved. Their congregations have noticed and are responding to their respective ministries. Most have seen growth in their congregations. Some have seen increased evangelism, or even revival. Some have even started churches while in the program:



one young man started two.



We were this rag tag, fly by the seat of our pants ministry, simply trying to keep up with God. While we are still that, now we at least appear to better know who we are and what we are about. Our website is important and enables us to accomplish several things.

## Sierra Leone Partnership Hits the Ground Running

This November we started two additional schools in Sierra Leone, Africa in Wellington and Waterloo. We were expecting 30 pastors in each location. We had 58 in Wellington and 56 in Waterloo. The pastors responded incredibly well to our training and said they have never received training like this. They are very excited and have already opened an office where pastors meet twice each week to pray for P2P and strategize about growing the school and taking the school to other parts of Africa.



Our national coordinator in Sierra Leone is Tamba Lebbie, who is the pastor at First Baptist Church in Waterloo. I asked him to gather those leaders interested in starting schools in additional locations. Twelve men met with me and are fired up to take our training to Africa. They have already identified 9 provincial cities in Sierra Leone to begin schools. They also asked permission to take P2P to the neighboring countries of Guinea and Liberia. Of course, I said yes and we are already strategizing together and preparing the pastors to go.



Since leaving Sierra Leone I have received many encouraging calls, texts, and emails from the pastors. They are anxious for us to return. I taught a preaching course in November and several have said their preaching has greatly improved. They thanked me, and several said their churches thank me as well. Please pray for Scott Bosier as he goes this March to teach Hermeneutics. This will be a much needed and challenging course for the pastors. I have no idea where this partnership is going, but I suspect this may well be our most prolific network. Please pray for a church to adopt this partnership. We are still waiting for a US coordinator and sponsor for this movement.



## New Developments and Opportunities

I will be leaving my role as pastor of Living Stones Church this year to focus full-time on P2P. Leading both ministries has simply become too much for a single person to accomplish. We are now directly training nearly 1000 pastors in 22 locations around the world and indirectly training over 2000 more through our national partners. We have identified 6 additional countries where we will begin schools in 2020. We are also in dialogue with leaders who represent many additional countries and potentially hundreds of new schools. To say that God is blessing this movement is a massive understatement.

Living Stones has been absolutely amazing in their support and are a model missions church. However, we have reached the point where Living Stones is no longer able to fully support all of the needs of this ministry: from both a leadership and financial perspective. For the first time we must leave the nest and become self-sufficient. This is an opportunity for others to be a part of this incredible ministry. I know of no other ministry that has as much kingdom impact using so few resources.

The kingdom ROI is astounding. We are not only training thousands of pastors and changing their lives and ministries, but through our students we are revitalizing churches, conventions, seeing evangelism and church planting. In El Salvador alone, we have seen students start over 50 churches. In Honduras, students are starting churches amongst unreached tribal groups in the mountains.



Our goal is to raise at least 150K in 2020. This support will fund my salary, a part-time administrator, travel and logistics, support for our national partners, translation costs, printing, overhead, and some pastor scholarships.
